La Monnaie de Paris will host from February 19th to 23rd, 2019, an exhibition called «Artistes à la Une, Togeth'her »® (« Cover Artists - Togeth'Her »), organized to support programs promoting gender equality and female empowerment, spearheaded by NATO Women.

The project gives carte blanche to 33 contemporary artists, women and men from around the world, inviting them to imagine on a (blank) Vogue Paris magazine cover, the portrait of a woman they see as iconic and inspiring. The 31 exceptional women thus represented have, each in their respective field, shifted the lines and boundaries of their time, and daringly, stylishly and creatively transformed the way we see the world. The artworks will be exhibited in rooms at La Monnaie de Paris and sold by famous auction house Christie's on behalf of the NATO Women France committee.

This project was conceived by curator David-Hervé Boutin, and participates in one of the main directions put forward by La Monnaie de Paris' art direction, driven by its Director Camille Morineau (who is also chairwoman of AWARE: Archive of Women Artists Research and Exhibition): supporting and showing the creation of women artists through exhibitions and events.

The exhibition's «catalogue» and the auction sale of all produced artworks, as well as an interview of each artist, conducted by Vogue, will be made available to readers and subscribers in the greater Paris region, with the magazine's February 2019 issue.

This project's prestigious partners, very involved in contemporary art, also share a special interest in the cause of women: Sisley (a partner of the operation), UBS, vente-privee and Christie's.

They all hope that this exhibition, free and open to the general public, will touch as many people as possible and, who knows, maybe inspire new generations.

The invited artists express, each in their own way, the diversity and freedom of expression and voices that this project defends. Internationally acclaimed artists are shown alongside the new generation. A geographic and cultural mix was also one of the key criteria for the choice of creators and muses, as well as a balance between male and female artists.
